Mr. Hemke is the first and only American ever to win the coveted First Prize in Saxophone at the Paris National Conservatory of Music. Pupil of the celebrated saxophone virtuoso, M. Marcel Mule. Mr. Hovey is Educational Director of H. & A. Selmer company, with a background of 30 years' experience in directing high school and college bands, most recently Chairman of the Music Education Department and director of the concert band at Butler University, Indianapolis, Indiana. He has served as lecturer, clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor in all sections of the United States and Ontario, Canada. More than 50 instrumental methods and books have been written or edited by Mr. Hovey.

He is a member of or affiliated with American Bandmasters, College Band Directors, Music Educators National Conference, Past President of Indiana Bandmasters, Honorary Member Canadian Bandmasters, member of Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Delta Kappa, Phi Mu Alpha, Kappa Kappa Psi and Phi Beta Mu.
