Lieutenant Colonel William F. Santelmann, leader of the world famous United States Marine Band from 1949 to 1955, is a native of Washington, D.C. Lt. Col. Santelmann began his study of the violin at the Conservatory of Music at Leipzig, Germany, and later entered the Washington College of Music where he graduated in 1920. He later enrolled as a student at the New England Conservatory of Music at Boston, Massachusetts and upon completing his studies there he began his career in the United States Marine Band in 1923 where he served under his father's direction until the latter's retirement in 1927.

In 1935 Lt. Col. Santelmann was appointed Assistant Leader and on April 1st, 1940 was appointed Leader and achieved the rank of Captain. Promotion to Major followed in 1947 and in 1951 he attained the highest rank ever held by a musician in the Marine Corps, Lieutenant Colonel. In the 32 years of service with the Marine Band, Santelmann toured in concert into every state in the country.

Since his retirement Lt. Col. Santelmann has made frequent appearances in all parts of the United States conducting Festivals, Clinics, and various organizations, including high school bands, symphony orchestras, and summer music camps.

It is his sincere hope that by conducting the youth of America, he may be able to give these young people the same inspiration to develop their musical education that he himself received in his youth.

We, the Bandmasters' Association of South Dakota, are indeed grateful to Lt. Col. Santelmann for his inspirational leadership and high musical standards so well expressed through out the 1963 All-State Band. It is through the efforts of such men as he that the need for musical expression and the performing arts will be realized and sustained.

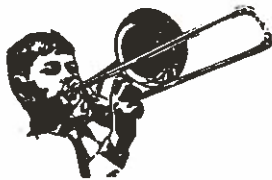

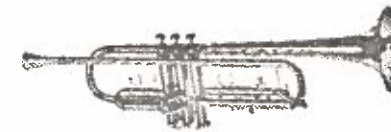
