COMMANDER - CONDUCTOR, UNITED STATES AIR FORCE BAND

Colonel Arnald D. Gabriel, dynamic conductor of the United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra and the Singing Sergeants in Washington, D. C., is the recipient of the first "Citation of Excellence" from the National Band Association. He is the only active Air Force musician to hold the Legion of Merit, one of the nation's highest peacetime awards. Later he was awarded the First Oak Leaf Cluster to the Legion of Merit as a result of his outstanding success achieved on the U. S. Air Force Band's 1968 good will tour of Latin America.

After being discharged from the armed forces Colonel Gabriel attended Ithaca College, New York, where he graduated cum laude in 1950 and then continued his studies, receiving the Masters degree in 1953.

He re-entered the service in 1951 as a Warrant Officer—Bandleader. From 1955 through 1958 he was Command Band Director of the Tactical Air Command Band at Langley Air Force Base, Virginia. He was appointed Command Band Director, United States Air Forces in Europe in 1958. It was during this unprecedented five-year tour of duty that he was awarded the Legion of Merit for his outstanding service to the United States through music.

In 1963 he was appointed Commander and Conductor of the United States Air Force Academy Band in Colorado. The following year he assumed his present assignment, Commander and Conductor of the United States Air Force Band in Washington, D. C.

Colonel Gabriel has guest conducted bands in Italy, Greece, Germany and Canada, as well as the Pittsburg, Minnesota, Memphis and York, Pa. Symphony Orchestras. He continually receives invitations from throughout the nation to appear as guest conductor at leading state, regional and university music festivals.

Alternates - - South Dakota All-State Band

All-State Band students are chosen by State-wide auditions. This year over 1,500 students were auditioned for places in the All-State Band. In most sections it is quite likely that some students will have the same audition score as some who are in the band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

- 1. A student whose school is not represented has first priority.
- 2. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
- 3. If neither of these criteria applies, the audition judge breaks the tie. Below is a list of students who tied for membership in All-State Band, but were eliminated by one of the above considerations:
