**Dr. Leonard B. Smith**

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the students of All-State Band are very proud to have Dr. Leonard B. Smith as the guest conductor for the 1973 All-State Band. The tremendous enthusiasm and personal energy Leonard Smith devotes to his musical career, combined with his great and several abilities rank him as one of the foremost personalities in the world of music today.

To many, the name "Leonard Smith" has come to be synonymous with "The World's Greatest Cornet Soloist." Students know Leonard Smith as the composer of "The Treasury of Scales" which, incidentally, is the most widely used band book of its kind in the world. Still others know Leonard Smith as the conductor of the Detroit Concert Band and the Scandinavian Symphony Orchestra or as a radio commentator. As if this were not enough, he is also nationally known in the business community as an outstanding executive. He is president of Accompaniments Unlimited, Inc., and has served for many years in the same capacity with Bandland, Inc.

Those of you old enough to remember the old radio program, "The Lone Ranger," heard Leonard Smith play the trumpet introduction of the theme. Some of his experiences in music have been the first chair cornetist and principal cornet soloist with the Goldman Band, the United States Navy Band, and the Ernest Williams Band. He also has been first trumpet with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, the Ford Sunday Evening Hour, the Philadelphia Orchestra, Voice of Firestone and the Barrere Little Symphony.

The Detroit Concert Band under his leadership since 1946 was selected by the British Broadcasting Corporation for an hour-long documentary on the life of John Philip Sousa. The BBC is quoted, "Of all the bands in the United States and Europe, there is no musical organization in the world that can play a Sousa March like the Detroit Concert Band."

His sparkling appearances as soloist, conductor and lecturer have been the feature of more than 3,500 concerts in state and national clinics throughout the United States and Canada. He is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), the American Bandmasters Association (ABA), and the American Federation of Musicians (AFM).

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association would like to take this opportunity to thank Dr. Leonard B. Smith for giving the students and directors the privilege of working with him these past two days. It has been inspirational and gratifying for the students to have had the opportunity to play under the direction of a man with such tremendous abilities.

## Alternates for South Dakota All-State Band

Students are selected for All-State Band by a competitive audition held in eleven cities. This year approximately 1500 students were auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. A student whose school is not represented is given first priority.
2. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
3. If neither of the above criteria applies, the audition judge breaks the tie.
