Commander - Conductor, United States Air Force Band

Colonel Arnald D. Gabriel, dynamic conductor of the United States Air Force Band, Symphony Orchestra and the Singing Sergeants in Washington, D. C., is the recipient of the first "Citation of Excellence" from the National Band Association. He is the only active Air Force musician to hold the Legion of Merit, one of the nation's highest peacetime awards. Later he was awarded the First Oak Leaf Cluster to the Legion of Merit as a result of his outstanding success achieved on the U. S. Air Force Band's 1968 good will tour of Latin America.

After being discharged from the armed forces where he served as a combat machine gunner with the 29th Infantry Division in the European theater of operation in World War II, Colonel Gabriel attended Ithaca College, New York, where he graduated cum laude in 1950 and then continued his studies, receiving the Masters degree in 1953.

He re-entered the service in 1951 as a Warrant Officer—Bandleader. From 1955 through 1958 he was Command Band Director of the Tactical Air Command Band at Langley Air Force Base, Virginia. He was appointed Command Band Director, United States Air Forces in Europe in 1958. It was during this unprecedented five-year tour of duty that he was awarded the Legion of Merit for his outstanding service to the United States through music.

In 1963 he was appointed Command and Conductor of the United States Air Force Academy Band in Colorado. The following year he assumed his present assignment, Commander and Conductor of the United States Air Force Band in Washington, D. C..

Colonel Gabriel has guest conducted bands in Italy, Greece, Germany and Canada, as well as the Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Memphis and New York, Pa. Symphony Orchestras. He continually receives invitations from throughout the nation to appear as guest conductor at leading state, regional and university music festivals.

ALTERNATES FOR SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

Students are selected for All-State Band by a competitive audition held in eleven cities. This year approximately 1150 students were auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. A student whose school is not represented is given first priority.
2. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
3. If neither of the above criteria applies, the audition judge breaks the tie.
