Dr. W. Francis McBeth

Dr. McBeth is Professor of Music, Resident Composer and Chairman of the Theory Composition Department at Ouachita University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, and has held this position since 1957. He was conductor of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra in Little Rock for many years until his retirement in 1973, whereupon he was elected Conductor Emeritus in honor of his work in the building of this superior professional orchestra. During his tenure at Ouachita he has become well known throughout the United States and abroad as a composer and conductor.

The most outstanding of his awards have been the Presley Award at Hardin-Simmons University, recipient of an ASCAP Special Award 1965, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, and 74, and the Howard Hanson Prize at the Eastman School of Music for his Third Symphony in 1963.

McBeth's formal training was received at Hardin-Simmons University, University of Texas and the Eastman School of Music. He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, Phi Beta Mu, Kappa Kappa Psi, Phi Mu Alpha and American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers.

He has been the conductor of All-State Bands and orchestras in Texas, Arkansas, Mississippi, Nebraska, Kansas, New Mexico, Indiana, Montana and California.

In 1974 Dr. McBeth conducted clinics and concerts for the Yamaha Company in Japan in the cities of Tokyo, Nagoya, Sendia, Sapporo, Osaka, Fukuoki and the Yamaha Music Camp. He has been guest lecturer at many universities in the United States and abroad.

"Capriccio Concertante"

(A commissioned work for the South Dakota Bicentennial Commission and the South Dakota Bandmasters Association)

This work has been written in a concertante style in which all the sections in the band perform thematic material. The theme for the entire work is a motif taken from a Sioux melody "The Prayer of the White Buffalo Call". It appears in the slow movement in its original form while in the fast movement one finds the theme in retrograde. It is a one movement work written in an ABA form (fast-slow-fast).

Dr. McBeth was commissioned to write the "Capriccio Concertante" by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and the South Dakota Bicentennial Commission for the 1976 Bicentennial year. The purpose of this commissioned work was to have a piece of music that could be performed by most of the bands in South Dakota during the 1976 year in commemoration of the Bicentennial in South Dakota. A conscious effort has been made to write a good number; not easy, but not complex so that it is playable by the high school bands. Tonight you will hear the premier performance of this work.

ALTERNATES FOR SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

Students are selected for All State Band by a competitive audition held in eleven cities. This year over 1,000 students were auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. A student whose school is not represented is given first priority.
 2. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
 3. If neither of the above criteria applies, the audition judge breaks the tie.
