## GUEST CONDUCTOR



**KENNETH G. BLOOMQUIST**  
MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY  
EAST LANSING, MICHIGAN

Kenneth G. Bloomquist, Professor of Music and Director of Bands, is the conductor of the Wind Symphony and Symphony Band at Michigan State University. In addition, he Chairs the School of Music which comprises 10 divisions and boasts a teaching force of approximately 100 faculty and graduate teaching assistants. Professor Bloomquist joined the MSU faculty in 1970, coming from the University of Kansas where he held the Director of Bands position. Degrees were earned at University of Illinois and his experience includes teaching in the public schools and military service in the U.S. Army.

Significant among his publications are "The Anatomy of a Rehearsal", in five parts, published by The Instrumentalist, 1981; "School Band Movement Phase II", Gemeinhardt, 1982, and "Pedal Tone Study for Trumpet", which the Getzen Company has printed every year since 1962.

Professor Bloomquist is the former National President of the National Band Association and is a member of the American Bandmasters Association, College Band Directors National Association, and Music Educators National Conference. He is the official representative of the School of Music to the National Association of Schools of Music and serves as an evaluator for accreditation in the NASM.

Professor Bloomquist has appeared as guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator throughout the United States, Europe, Scandinavia, Southeast Asia, Australia, and Mexico. He continues to maintain an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator.

## DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

The South Dakota High School Activities Association is pleased to present the Distinguished Service Award to two gentlemen who have served the youth of South Dakota for many years. They have contributed to the musical growth of a multitude of students that have been under their direction. A resume of their services follows:

### Douglas Carpenter, Watertown

Mr. Carpenter's teaching career spans 40 years and includes directing bands at Fedora, Alexandria, Mitchell, Geddes, Tripp and Watertown. He has held every office in the South Dakota Bandmasters Association and in the Phi Beta Mu National Bandmasters Fraternity. He has spent countless hours in managing the affairs of SDBA and in organizing the South Dakota All-State Band membership each year. Honors include the Kappa Kappa Outstanding Band Director Award in 1958, South Dakota Teacher of the Year in 1975, Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Band Director in 1976, the "Mac" Award in 1986, and the Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Service Award in 1987. In March of 1987, he was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association.

### Len Vellek, Huron

Currently in his 29th year as a Band Director in South Dakota, Mr. Vellek taught eight years at Scotland prior to coming to Huron High School in 1967. He has been a member of South Dakota Bandmasters Association for 29 years and past president of SDBA and Phi Beta Mu. He has also been a member of NARD and ABA. He has acted as chairman for South Dakota All-State Band auditions for 21 years and as local chairman for All-State Band in Huron in 1977 and 1984. He has served as a board member of the Region IV Music Committee and the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee.

## ALTERNATES FOR SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

Students are selected for All-State Band by a competitive audition held in nine cities. This year 887 students registered to be auditioned for positions in the All-State Band. It is likely that there will be some with the same audition score as those who are in the Band. The following considerations are used in breaking tie scores:

1. Former members.
2. Former alternates.
3. A student whose school is not represented is given first preference.
4. Upper-classmen are given preference over under-classmen.
5. If none of the above criteria applies, the audition judges break the tie.

Below is a list of students who tied for membership in the All-State Band, but were eliminated by one of the above considerations.
