**Timothy Mahr** 

Timothy Mahr is an associate professor of music at St. Olaf College in Northfield, MN, where he is the Conductor of the St. Olaf College Band. In addition, he teaches courses in composition and conducting. Previous to this 1994 appointment, he was the Director of Bands at the University of Minnesota, Duluth for ten years. He was also the founder and conductor of the community-based Twin Ports Wind Ensemble. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Minnesota Band Directors Association.

Mahr is active as a guest conductor and clinician, conducting All-State Bands, honor band festivals, clinics and performances of his works across the nation and in Norway and Canada. His interpretations have earned the praise of notable composers such as Gian Carlo Menotti, Warren Benson, Vincent Persichetti, Ned Rorem, Ellen Taffe Zwilich, Timothy Borege and Fisher Tull.

Mahr is well known as a composer and has nearly 40 serious works to his credit, eleven of which have bee contracted for publication. He recently received the 1991 ABA/Ostwald Award for his piece "The Soaring Hawk". His works have been performed at Lincoln Center in New York, the Midwest International and Orchestra Clinic, the national conventions of the American Bandmasters Association, Music Educators National Conference and the College Band Directors National Association, as well as numerous state and regional conventions. His compositions have been and continue to be preformed by the U.S. Marine Band, U.S. Air Force Band, other armed service bands, major university bands, all-state bands, and ensembles in seventeen countries on four continents. Many of his works have been broadcast on the Minnesota Public Radio network. Recordings of his works can be found on the Crest and Mark labels.

Mahr was the first recipient of the American Bandmasters Association Commissioning Project and the resultant work, "Endurance", was premiered by the United States Interservice Band in Washington, DC. He has also received commissions for the United States Air Force Band, the Music Educators National Conference, the Nebraska and Indiana Bandmasters Associations, St. Olaf College, The University of Iowa, The University of Minnesota, Duluth, the University of Louisville, Hastings College(NE), Anoka High School (MN), La Crosse Central High School (WI), Tipton High School (IA), Bowling Green High School (OH), the Knightwind Ensemble of Milwaukee, and the Nebraska Wind Symphony. He has been awarded grants from Meet the Composer and the Minnesota Composers Forum, as well as the National Band Association's "Citation of Excellence". He was elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association in 1993 and serves on the Adjudicating Committee for the ABA/Ostwald Award.

Mahr is a graduate of St. Olaf College (B.M. Theory/Composition and B.A. Music Education) and received a masters degree in trombone performance from the University of Iowa, where he is presently a doctoral candidate in instrumental conducting. He taught instrumental music at Milaca High School, Milaca, MN for three years.

During this evening's concert various special presentations will be made. Included in these presentations will be the induction of two individuals into the SDBA "Hall of Fame", the presentation of two SDHSAA "Distinguished Service Awards" and the presentation of the "NFIMA Outstanding Music Educator Award".

### SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

#### PAUL CHRISTENSEN, Huron (1899-1962)

Paul Christensen was born in Denmark and with his family immigrated to South Dakota in 1908. While attending Huron High School, he was both a talented musician and a star athlete. After attending Huron College, he joined the famous John Philip Sousa band as principal saxophonist, touring with the band throughout the United States for two years (1921 and 1922).

After leaving the Sousa band he organized an directed his own "hotel" orchestra, playing in Des Moines, Omaha, Colorado Springs and Oklahoma City. While in Oklahoma City he was appointed musical director for two major radio stations in Oklahoma City.

He returned to South Dakota in 1940 and while living in Huron directed various high school bands in the area, including, Alpena, Hitchcock, Tulare, and Wessington Springs. He was appointed director of the Huron Municipal band 1947. In 1951 he began teaching music in the Huron Public Schools where he continued until his death in 1962.

As director of bands at Huron High School he became noted for his great bands. His entertaining and very musical basketball tournament bands seemed to bridge the gap between music and athletics. He was soon known as "Mr. Music Man."

He was a charter member of Phi Beta Mu/Sigma Chapter National Bandmaster's Fraternity, a member of SDBA, SDEA, NEA, and MENC. In 1956 he was the second person from South Dakota to be elected to the American Bandmasters Association. He was elected to the American School Band Directros Association in 1955. He also was a member of the first All-American Bandmasters Band in Chicago that same year.

He was received the Kappa Kappa Psi Award/USD for the Outstanding High School Band Director in South Dakota in 1957. He also served on the LeBlanc Music Educators' National Advisory Board in 1961.

He was recognized in Who's Who for South Dakota in 1956 and 1961. For several years he served as superintendent of bands at the SD State Fair. He was a board member of the Huron Community Concert Association, the Sousa Band Fraternal Society and was well known as a composer.

Mr. Christensen hosted the SD All-State Band in 1952 and 1958.

He received an honorary degree, Master of Fine Arts, posthumously from Huron College.

#### HAROLD HAMAKER, Mitchell

Prior to teaching his 29 years in the Mitchell Public Schools, Harold Hamaker taught at Davis, Avon, Menno, and Volca. SD.

Harold was on the committee that organized the first South Dakota All-State Band in 1951. He was also chairman of the committee that organized the first All-State Chorus and Orchestra.

For nine years he was chairman of the Grade School Music Contests, sponsored by SDBA.

In 1964 he was listed in the twenty-first edition of Who's Who in American Education. He received the Phi Beta Mu South Dakota Outstanding Bandmasters Award in 1971. In 1982 he also receive the SD Music Educators Recognition Award. In 1985 he received the Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Award.

He was a member of the Mitchell Municipal band for 32 years. He was a guest clinician, adjudicator and conductor for various festivals in SD, including guest conducting a high school band at the summer camp at USD.

The Mitchell High School Band, under his direction, played for numerous SDEA conventions, the USD Mid-Winter Band Clinic in 1966 and for the MENC conference in Omaha, NE, in 1957.

Mr. Hamaker was a member of MENC, ASBDA, SDBA, Phi Beta Mu, and SDMEA. He also served as president of SDMEA.

#### DR. PAUL CHERRY, Vermillion

Dr. Paul Cherry has been Professor of Woodwinds and Musicology at the University of South Dakota for the past twenty-eight years. Prior to his appointment at USD he taught at Tennessee Technological University, and for a number of years he was a high school band director in Florida. He has always been active as a performer, and has been Principal Clarinetist with a number of orchestras and bands including the Sioux City Symphony, the American Ballet Theatre Orchestra in New York, and the United States Military Academy Band at West Point. He is a frequent soloist with the Municipal Band in Sioux City. Dr. Cherry has a deep interest in working with young students, and frequently presents woodwind clinics and help sessions for high school bands, and he also presents workshops in historical dance for high school choirs that wish to incorporate Renaissance dances in their

Christmas madrigal dinners. Dr. Cherry is active as a judge at music contests in Iowa, South Dakota, and Nebraska, and this year marks his eighteenth consecutive year as woodwind adjudicator of the South Dakota All-State Band.



#### JOHN F. COLSON, Brookings

John Colson is Professor of Music and Director of Orchestra and Brass Activities at South Dakota State University. He is also the Music Director and Conductor of the SDSU-Civic Symphony. At South Dakota State University, Professor Colson teaches trumpet, french horn, brass pedagogy, and conducting. He is the Program Coordinator for the Brookings Chamber Music Society. Presently, he is enjoying his 29th year at South Dakota State University.

For the past 26 years, Professor Colson has served as a judge for the South Dakota All-Sate Orchestra Auditions. Previously to that, he was the brass and percussion judge for the South Dakota All-State Band auditions. He has also been a contest adjudicator for regional contests throughout South Dakota and

the Midwest. Professor Colson initiated, directed, and taught at the South Dakota All-State Music Camp for the past 27 years. He also initiated and taught at the Rushmore Junior High Music Camp in the Black Hills. He was selected as the Conductor for the J. Laiten Weed Honors Orchestra in 1990.

Professor Colson's biography has appeared in The International, Who's Who in Music, Dictionary of International Biography, and Personalities of America. He has received the Certificate of Appreciation form the Brookings Area Chamber of Commerce and, recently was given the Distinguished Service Award by Phi Beta Mu Sigma.

#### DAVID HAUGEN, Stoux Falls

David Haugen is a successful educator at the high school and middle school levels with an outstanding record in marching and concert competions. He has been involved in teaching instrumental music since 1964. His career as an educator has included stops in Goldfield, IA (1964-67); Windom, MN (1967-69); South St. Paul, MN (1969-72); Anoka, MN (1972-77) and Sioux Falls, SD (1977-present). He has served as a conductor, clinician, workshop presenter and adjudicator in Wisconsin, Nebraska, Iowa, Minnesota and South Dalvate.

Haugen's musicians have consistently exhibited a high level of excellence. The following are just a few of the many sweepstakes awards won by his band at Lincoln High School: Red River Exhibition, Winnipeg, Canada, 1980; Tri-State Band Festival, Luverne, MN, 1983-87; Quad-State Band Festival,

Vermillion, 1985-89; Cherry Blossom Festival, Washington, DC, 1983; Strawberry Festival, Buckhannon, West Virginia, 1986; Rose Blossom Festival, Canon City, Colorado, 1989 and Brookings Optimists Invitational, 1983-84 and 1986-88.

He is a member of NBA, MENC, Phi Beta Mu and NEA. He has held a number of offices in the various organizations including: SDMEA Band Chairman, 1980-82; National Federation NFIMA Music Committee, 1988-89; SDBA Executive Board, 1983-87; SDBA President Elect, 1987-89; SDBA President 1989-91 and Phi Beta Mu Honorary Band Director Fraternity State President, 1994-present.

Dr. Bruce Ammann, Augustana College, has said: "David Haugen is a model music educator. He has always been involved in the state and national music organizations....He is sincerely interested in all aspects of music education as can be observed in his teaching career he is interested in music education at all levels."
