Col. John R. Bourgeois

Colonel John R. Bourgeois has recently retired as the 25th Commander and Conductor of "The President's Own" United States Marine Band. As Director of the Marine Band and Music Advisor to the White House, his career has spanned nine presidential administrations from President Eisenhower to President Clinton. Under his leadership, the Marine Band presented its first overseas performances, traveling to the Netherlands, Ireland, Norway, and England. In 1990, Colonel Bourgeois led the band on a historic 18-day concert tour of the former Soviet Union. In addition, Colonel Bourgeois conducted over 16 national concert tours to bring the music of "The President's Own" to thousands of people across the country.

Colonel Bourgeois is active in numerous organizations throughout the country including the American Bandmasters Association, the John Philip Sousa Foundation, the National Band Association, the International Military Music Society, the Military Order of the Carabao and the Alfalfa Club. Among the many awards and honors Colonel Bourgeois has received are the Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Award, the Medal of Honor of the Mid-West Band and Orchestra Clinic, the Star of Sudler Order of Merit from the John Philip Sousa Foundation, and the Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia National Citation "for service and dedication to music and country."

SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME



Milo Winter, Rapid City
Milo Winter is retired Director of Bands at Stevens High School in Rapid City where he also served as school district Band Coordinator. A native of Alpena, SD, he earned his B.A. degree at Augustana College and masters degree at the University of S.D. His teaching career of 39 years included eleven years at Beresford and two years in U. S. Army Bands in Colorado and Germany before moving to Rapid City.

Bands under his direction earned honors at the Winnipeg, Canada International Exposition, marching band competitions in Colorado and S.D., and first places in concert and parade events at the National Cherry Blossom Festival in Washington. D.C. The Stevens Symphonic Band performed at the S.D. Bandmasters Convention twice and at the Colorado Bandmasters Convention in Vail. Two European concert tours included performances behind the "Iron Curtain" in Czechoslovakia in the

1970's. The 17th Sudler Flag was presented to the Stevens Band program in 1986 by the Sousa Foundation for excellence in concert, solo, small ensemble, jazz, and All State accomplishments. The Stevens Band performed at the 1987 Tournament of Roses Parade and toured Australia, New Zealand, and Hawaii in 1993.

Winter was elected to membership in the American Bandmasters Association in 1980, is a member of the National Band Association, Phi Beta Mu, SDMEA, MENC, and its past-president of the S.D. Bandmasters Association. He received the Phi Beta Mu Outstanding Bandmaster Award and Distinguished Service Award, the SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award, the S.D. School of Mines Service to Education Award, the Arts Council Educator of the Year honor and in 1990 the Outstanding Music Educator Award from the National Federation Interscholastic Music Association (NFIMA). He was twice selected for the Presidential Scholar Program Awards and in 1992, received the Augustana College Outstanding Alumni Award. In 1994 he was the recipient of the Rushmore Honors Award for cultural activities.

Winter frequently serves as guest conductor or adjudicator for contests and festivals and has been a presenter at the Nebraska Bandmasters Convention, a consultant for Band Week in Canada, and directed music camp bands in S.D., N.D., Colorado, Texas, and Tennessee. He is co-director of the Rapid City Municipal Band and with his wife Ruth serves as a site manager for music festivals in the U.S. and Canada.

NATIONAL FEDERATION INTERSCHOLASTIC MUSIC AWARD



Marlin A. Pedersen, Gregory

Marlin Pedersen has been involved with teaching music since 1959, when he started teaching K-12 vocal and instrumental music at Volga, SD. From 1963-89 he taught 5-12 instrumental music in Gregory, SD. In 1982-83, he directed the Gregory High School choral music program along with the instrumental program. From 1989-94, he taught 6-8 instrumental music and assisted in supervising the high school solo and ensemble contest students and the All-State Band auditionees in Winner, SD.

Since 1994, Pedersen has provided private instrumental lessons and served as a music consultant for various area schools. He has served as an instructor at the Rushmore Music Camp in the Black Hills since 1972.

Pedersen is a member of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (member of the Board and State ADBA President), South Dakota Music Educators (band representative on the State Board), Phi Beta Mu (board member and as State President), National Band Association, American School Band Directors Association, and the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee. He has been an adjudicator for both high school and middle school contests throughout South Dakota and parts of Nebraska as well as a clinic-festival conductor in several South Dakota and Nebraska communities...

Although his marching band and jazz band won numerous awards, Pedersen's main emphasis was always the concert band. It was always his belief that good bands were built by participation in solos and ensembles. While teaching at Gregory, the grade 9-12 school enrollment fluctuated around 150 students. Pedersen maintained a band enrollment of over 100 students.

Milo Winter former band director at Rapid City Stevens, said: "Perhaps Mr. Pedersen's most highly regarded contribution to music education is his total unselfishness in giving of his time and talents to others including both teachers and students."
