ALL-STATE BAND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The members of the All-State Band were selected by auditioning at one of the five audition centers throughout the State. The four audition judges fly around the State to each site over a period of six days and listen to students. From that number the 171 students that are in this year's band were selected. The members of the Band represent 52 South Dakota schools. There are 77 seniors, 51 juniors, 29 sophomores and 14 freshmen in the band.

In this year's band there are nine students who have played in All-State Band for four years. They are:

GUEST CONDUCTOR



JAMES BARNES

As a member of both the History and Theory-Composition faculties at the University of Kansas, Professor James Barnes teaches orchestration, arranging and composition courses and wind band history and repertoire courses. At KU, he served as an Assistant, and later, Associate Director of Bands for 27 years.

His numerous publications for concert band and orchestra are extensively performed in the United States, Europe and the Pacific Basin. His works have been performed at Tanglewood, Boston Symphony Hall, Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall and the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C.

Barnes twice received the coveted American Bandmasters Association Ostwald Award for outstanding contemporary wind band music. He has been the recipient of numerous ASCAP Awards for composers of serious music, the Kappa Kappa Psi Distinguished Service to Music Medal and the Bohumil Makovsky Award for Outstanding College Band Conductors, along with numerous other honors and grants. The world famous Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra has recorded three CD's of his music. Mr. Barnes recently completed a new CD of his works with the Koninklijke Militaire Kapel (The Queen's Royal Military Band) in Holland. In recent years, he has been commissioned to compose works for all five of the major military bands in Washington, DC. A recent CD by the United States Air Force Band features his *Third Symphony*.

Mr. Barnes has traveled extensively as a guest composer, conductor and lecturer throughout the United States, Europe, Australia, Japan and Taiwan. He is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP), the American Bandmasters Association and numerous other professional organizations and societies. Since 1984, his music has been published exclusively by Southern Music Company of San Antonio, Texas.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

During this evening's concert various special presentations will be made. Included in these presentations will be the induction of an individual into the SDBA "Hall of Fame" and the presentation of the NFIMA Award.

SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

Dr. Warren Hatfield

Dr. Warren Hatfield taught school in Solon, IA from 1956-58 and Hinsdale, IL from 1959-61 before coming to South Dakota State University in 1961 as Director of Bands. He served in that capacity until 1973. In 1966, he was at the University of Iowa while on sabbatical from SDSU. He became Head of the SDSU Music Department in 1967 and served in that capacity until retiring in 1993. He established the All-State Music Camp at SDSU. He was responsible for beginning the jazz ensemble program at SDSU and continued as Director of Jazz Activities until 1981. His bands were recognized for their excellence in performance.

He worked tirelessly on behalf of the band movement in South Dakota and served as a guest conductor in every comer of the state bringing his wisdom and enthusiasm for music to students and colleagues alike.

He was a member in good standing of the South Dakota Bandmasters Association throughout his entire tenure in South Dakota. He served the organization with tireless energy as its President, as an All-State Band Judge, and as host of the Annual South Dakota Bandmasters Association Clinic for 32 years.

Dr. Hatfield was the recipient of numerous awards garnered in recognition of his achievements in the band field and for his caring, giving approach to so many of the young instrumentalists of the state. He was the recipient of the South Dakota Chapter of Phi Beta Mu/SD Bandmasters Distinguished Service Award in 1980. He was recognized in "Who's Who in American Music" and "Outstanding Educators of America". In 1981, he was appointed to the South Dakota Arts Council and served until 1993. He devoted his career to serving students and educators in the cause of achieving the highest musical standards and artistic excellence in performance. In retirement, he still serves music educators and students as a guest conductor, consultant and teacher.

NATIONAL FEDERATION INTERSCHOLASTIC MUSIC AWARD

Dr. Harry Krueger



Dr. Krueger joined the Augustana College Music Department staff in 1965. He was the conductor of the Augustana Brass Choir for 28 years and Chair of the Department of Music for the final years of his career at Augustana College.

A Native of Minnesota, he began his teaching career in 1950 as a high school band and choir director in Calmar, IA. He held positions as a high school band director at Britt, IA and Glencoe, MN. During the years 1956-65, he was Associate Professor of Music at St. Cloud State University in St. Cloud, MN. From 1965 until he retired in 1993, he taught at Augustana College.

Although, retired from classroom teaching, Dr. Krueger is still active in Music. He has completed 16 years as a South Dakota All-State Band adjudicator. He still serves on the board of the South Dakota Music Educators Association and has maintained his membership in the South Dakota Bandmasters Association since 1965.

He is much in demand as a guest conductor, soloist and adjudicator/clinician in the upper Midwest and has served for over 30 years in summer music camps notably at the International Music Camps, Rushmore Music Camp, Purdue Band Camp, Dorian Music Camp and the South Dakota All-State Music Camp.

Dr. Krueger is past president of the South Dakota Music Educators Association, as well as past state band chair for the National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors and the past chair of the Midwest division of the National Band Association. In 1971 he recieved the honor of being the first person in South Dakota to receive the "Citation of Excellence Award" from the National Band Association and in 1980 received the prestigious "Carlo A. Sperati Award" from Luther College. In 1989 he received the "Burlington Northern Excellence in Teaching Award" from Augustana College. He was also the recipient of the "Outstanding Achievement in Music Award" from the Phi Beta Mu in 1988. In 1995 he received the "Outstanding Alumnus Award" from Luther College. In 1996, he was presented the SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award in recognition of his contributions to the youth of South Dakota.
