#### **CURVIN FARNHAM**

University of Maine - Orono, ME



Curvin G. Farnham is a Professor of Music and Director of Bands at the University of Maine in Orono, where he conducts the University Symphonic Band, teaches courses in instrumental music education and teaches conducting at the graduate level. He is also the Coordinator of the School of Performing Arts.

Professor Farnham received his B.M. in Music Education from the Northern Conservatory of Music and did his graduate work at the Vandercook College of Music in Chicago. He has studied conducting with Richard Castiglione formerly of the Boston

Conservatory and Anthony Maiello, Director of Instrumental Studies at George Mason University.

He is past president of the Maine Music Educators Association. In 1985, he was elected to the American School Band Directors Association and in 1990 he become a member of Pi Kappa Lambda. Mr. Farnham holds membership in the Music Educators National Conference, the College Band Directors National Association , the New England College Band Directors Association, and the National Band Association. He holds honorary membership in both Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma. In the spring of 2001, he was recognized as Music Educator of the Year by the Maine Music Educators Association.

Mr. Farnham appears throughout the United States and Canada as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor and has guest conducted at several national and international festivals including the Atlantic Band Festival in Halifax Nova Scotia, the Music Educators National Conference (Eastern Division), the International Band Festival in Winnipeg, Manitoba, and the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago.



#### LEWIS BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

#### ANTHONY MAIELLO

George Mason University – Fairfax, VA



Anthony J. Maiello received his bachelor's and master's degrees in music from Ithaca College. He also studied at the National Conducting Institute in Washington, D.C., under the direction of Mr. Leonard Slatkin, Musical Director of the National Symphony Orchestra. He also serves as a Cover Conductor for the National Symphony Orchestra at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Washington, D.C.

Mr. Maiello's many professional credits include clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor of All-State

ensembles hroughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, England, Europe, The Netherlands and The Bahamas. He conducted musical activities for the Gold Medal Ceremonies at the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, New York, the New York State Music Camp & Institute; has served as New York State Music Association adjudicator; clinician with Yamaha, and clinician for Warner Bros. Publications, President of the International Association of Jazz Educators - New York State Chapter and as Musical Director for Music Festivals International. He is an elected member of The American Bandmasters Association and ASCAP, and holds membership in the National Band Association, College Band Directors National Association, New York State School Music Association, Virginia Music Educators Association, Virginia Jazz Service Organization, The College Music Society and The American Symphony Orchestra League.

Mr. Maiello's academic experience includes extensive teaching in the public schools. He served as Professor of Music and Chairman of Performance at the Crane School of Music, Potsdam College of SUNY, Potsdam, New York, where his duties included advanced instrumental conducting and conductor of the Crane Wind Ensemble. Under his direction, the ensembles at Crane and George Mason University have commissioned many new works, made numerous recordings and appearances at regional and national conferences in the United States and Canada. He is the author of CONDUCTING: A HANDS-ON-APPROACH and co-author of the 21st CENTURY BAND METHOD.

Anthony Maiello travels widely presenting clinics, lectures and workshops, and guest conducting and adjudicating numerous music festivals. He is presently Professor of Music and Director of Instrumental Studies at George Mason University, Fairfax, Virginia where he conducts the Symphony Orchestra and Wind Symphony and teaches several conducting courses. Professor Maiello was awarded the title of "University Professor" by the Board of Visitors, the highest rank given to faculty members at George Mason University. Mr. Maiello has also served as Associate Conductor of The McLean Orchestra, McLean, Virginia, has been appointed an Honorary Conductor of The United States Navy Band, Washington, D.C. and is presently the conductor of the American Festival Philharmonic Orchestra, Washington, D.C.

#### David Haugen



David Haugen a recently retired after serving 43 years as a director of bands. His years of experience include teaching at high schools in Goldfield, IA, Windom, MN, South St. Paul, MN, and most recently Sioux Falls Lincoln and Roosevelt High Schools. He concluded his career teaching in elementary and middle schools of Sioux Falls.

Mr. Haugen received his BA Degree from Luther College in 1964 and MA Degree from the University of Northern Colorado in 1968.

He has served as guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator for festivals and contests in South Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Nebraska, and Arizona. Bands conducted by Mr. Haugen have received Sweepstakes Awards at many regional and national events. These include the Red River Exhibition (Winnipeg, Canada), Cherry Blossom Festival (Washington, DC), Strawberry Festival (Buckhannon, West Virginia), and the Rose Blossom Festival (Canon City, Colorado). The Anoka Marching Band directed by Mr. Haugen was selected to be the official Minnesota band marching in the 1976 Presidential Inaugural Parade in Washington, DC. The South St. Paul Band was Minnesota State Fair Champions during his tenure there. Articles authored by Mr. Haugen have appeared in The Instrumentalist and South Dakota Musician.

Mr. Haugen's personal accomplishments include: Outstanding Band Director Award from Phi Beta Mu, Distinguished Band Master Award from the American School Band Directors Association, Carlo Sperati Award for Excellence in Music Education from Luther College, Outstanding Music Educator Award from the National Federation of Interscholastic Music Association, Distinguished Service Award from phi Beta Mu, and the Lincoln High School Hall of Fame. He has served as the Band Chairman for the SDMEA, Regional Representative for the National Federation of Interscholastic Music Association, President of the South Dakota Band Masters Association and President of the South Dakota Phi Beta Mu Chapter.

Mr. Haugen's wife, Joan, is a retired elementary teacher. Daughter, Cara, is a fifth grade teacher and son, Kyle, is a high school director of bands.

#### Dale Fiedler, Redfield



Dale Fiedler received his Bachelors Degree in Music Education from Northern State University in Aberdeen with a double major in instrumental and vocal music. Following his graduation in 1977, he accepted a teaching position in the Redfield school district and has taught there for thirty-one years.

musicians have had a history of success. Prior to this year his Concert Band received thirty consecutive Superior (Division I) ratings at the Region IV Music Contest. His Redfield High School "Marching Pheasants" have received numerous first place awards including a first place in their division at the 2007 International Lions Parade in Chicago. The Redfield High School Jazz Ensemble received first place at the Northern University Jazz Festival fourteen times.

He has been an active adjudicator judging music competitors from grade school through the collegiate level. He has also served as a guest conductor at numerous music festivals throughout the state. He takes pride in being a mentor for numerous future music educators who have received their student teaching experience from him.

He has held numerous leadership positions in the music community including a term on the South Dakota Bandmasters Executive Board, and a term as the President of the Bandmasters Association. He was appointed to membership on the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee for five years and served for one year as the Chairman of the Committee.

In 2003, Fiedler was named the South Dakota Bandmaster of the Year.

## SDHSAA "DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD"

#### Judy Kroll, Brookings - Category: Coach & Director



After graduating from Groton High School, Judy Kroll attended Northern State University where she received a BS degree in Speech Communications and Political Science. In the fall of 1974 she began teaching and coaching debate and individual events for four years at Madison High School. In addition to coaching debate she coached the Madison Oral Interp program for one year and directed plays for two years.

She returned to school for one year then taught and coached debate and individual events at Parkston for one year. In 1980 Kroll moved to Brookings where she is in her twenty-eighth year of teaching and coaching.

During her thirty-three years of coaching debate and individual events, Kroll's teams have compiled an impressive record. Brookings has had eight State "AA" Policy Debate Champions and an additional eight State Policy Debate Runner-Up teams. She has had 105 contestants qualify for the National Forensic League National Tournament. At the National Tournament, her Policy Debate Teams have placed 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup>. Eight other Brookings teams have finished in the top 25 at the National Tournament. Kroll has had 25 policy debaters receive the D.C. Reutter (All-State Debate) Award.

Kroll has served as the NFL District Chairperson for South Dakota and the Northern South Dakota District for twenty-six years. For twenty-two years she has been the Co-Director of the Speech Communication Association of South Dakota Debate Camp. She has served as an official for the National Forensic League National Tournament.

Kroll is a former president of the Speech Communication Association of South Dakota and a two time member of the SDSCA Executive Board. She has served nine years as a member of the SDHSAA Speech Advisory Committee. She has been named the South Dakota Forensic Coaches Association "Coach-of-the-Year" five times and received the Speech Communications Association of South Dakota "Distinguished Service" Award.

### BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process since that time. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.
