MARCELLUS BROWN Boise State University – Boise, ID



Marcellus Brown came to Boise State University in the fall of 1989 as Director of Band Organizations and Professor of Trumpet. Presently, he teaches trumpet, instrumental conducting and serves as the Director of the University Symphonic Winds and the Treasure Valley Concert.


A native of Detroit, Michigan, Mr. Brown holds a Masters of Music Degree in Trumpet Performance and Bachelor of Music Education Degree from the

University of Michigan where he took conducting classes with Elizabeth Green. He has done doctoral work at the University of Illinois where he studied conducting with Harry Begian, Professor Emeritus of Bands

Mr. Brown has done extensive work as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States. This includes appearances as a guest conductor at the Mid-West International Band and Orchestra Clinic in Chicago, Illinois and he has taught advanced conducting for the VanderCook School of Music Summer Session.

Mr. Brown has been recognized for his work and dedication as an educator at Boise State University as the recipient of the 2002 Excellence In Teaching Award presented by the LDS Student Association, the 2002 Faculty/Staff Larry G. Selland Humanitarian Award presented by the University Women's Center and one of ten Honored Faculty of the 2003 Top Ten Student Scholar Awards.

In 2006 Mr. Brown was elected into the American Bandmasters Association and he is currently serving as President of the College Band Directors National Association Northwestern Division and this past year (2008) he was elected to the board of the National Band Association.

CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

DR. PETER LOEL BOONSHAFT

Hofstra University – Hempstead, NY



Called "one of the most exciting and exhilarating voices in music education today," Peter Loel Boonshaft has been invited to speak or conduct in every state in the nation and around the world. He is author of the critically acclaimed books *Teaching Music with Passion* and *Teaching Music with Purpose*, as well as the soon to be released, *Teaching Music with*

Promise. He is currently on the faculty of Hofstra University in Hempstead, New York, where he is Professor of Music and Director of the Graduate Conducting Program. Dr. Boonshaft has received official proclamations from the Governors of four states and a Certificate of Appreciation from former President Ronald Reagan, as well as performing for former President and Mrs. George Bush, former President Bill Clinton, and for Margaret Thatcher, former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. His honors also include being selected three times as a National Endowment for the Arts "Artist in Residence," three times awarded Honorary Life Membership in the Tri-M Music Honor Society, and being selected for the Center for Scholarly Research and Academic Excellence at Hofstra University.

Extremely active as a guest conductor and educational speaker for conferences, festivals, concerts and workshops nationally and internationally, he has guest conducted the MENC (The National Association for Music Education) All-Eastern Band, MENC All-Northwest Band, MENC All-Eastern Directors Band, and Goldman Memorial Band. He was also named conductor of the MENC National High School Honors Band for the National Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. He has served as a speaker for the Canadian Music Educators Association National Convention, MENC National Conference, Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic, Music For All/Bands and Orchestras of America Symposium, Samuel Barber Institute for Music Educators, Music Education Center of America, Conn-Selmer Institute, NESA Council of Overseas Schools Conference in Bangkok, Thailand, and as keynote speaker for the MENC Northwest Division Conference, MENC Southern Division Conference, European Music Educators Convention, National Convention of the American String Teachers Association, National Convention of the American School Band Directors Association, ACDA Western Division Conference, and numerous state and regional music education conventions.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

SOUTH DAKOTA BANDMASTERS HALL OF FAME

Lawrence L. Mitchell - Vermillion



When he retired from teaching and became Director of Band Emeritus in August of 2006, Lawrence L. Mitchell had completed thirty-two years as a member of the University of South Dakota music faculty.

Dr. Mitchell received his B.F.A. degree in Music Education from the University of South Dakota and his M.A., M.F.A., and D.M.A. degrees in Trombone Performance from the University of Iowa. He taught public school instrumental music in Rock Valley, Iowa

(1961-1966). During 1966-1968 Dr. Mitchell attended the University of Iowa where he was a low brass teaching assistant, a graduate assistant with the University of Iowa bands, and Assistant Director of the University of Iowa Summer Music Camps. In 1968 Dr. Mitchell returned to public school teaching and taught instrumental music at Humboldt, Iowa. In 1970 he was appointed Assistant Director of Bands and Professor of Low Brass at Central Missouri State University where he served from until 1973. In the fall of 1973 Dr. Mitchell returned to the University of South Dakota as Professor of Low Brass and Assistant Director of Bands.

During his tenure at USD; Dr. Mitchell served as Director of the USD Marching Coyotes, the USD Jazz Ensembles, the USD Wind Ensembles, and the USD Symphonic Band. He taught low brass, conducting; instrumental literature and methods; music literature; and jazz and classical music appreciation. He served as the Department of Music Chairperson for eleven years. He founded and hosted the Quad State Marching Competition, the USD Coyote Jazz Festival, the USD High School Honor Band Festival, the High School Corps Marching Camp, and the Instrumental Music Director's Summer Institute. He was the Director of the Upper Midwest Summer Junior/Senior Music Camp.

Dr. Mitchell is actively involved in trombone performance with the Sioux City Symphony and the Symphony Brass Quintet. In June of 2003 he became the conductor of the Sioux City Municipal Band where he directs for the eight week summer season. Dr. Mitchell remains active within the quad-state region as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor for honor bands and festivals. In 1976 he was selected as the USD faculty member of the year. He was the 1996 recipient of the Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Service Award as well as the South Dakota Outstanding Bandmaster of the Year Award. During his April 30, 2006 final university band concert Dr. Mitchell was awarded an Executive Proclamation by Governor Mike Rounds proclaiming April 30, 2006 as Dr. Lawrence Mitchell Day. Dr. Mitchell is the 2008 recipient of the Northwest Iowa Bandmasters Association Jay Wicker Service Award and the 2008 Northwest Iowa Bandmasters Association Karl King Award (Retired).

BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process since that time. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.
