



CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

Anthony Maiello-George Mason University, Fairfax, VA



Professor Maiello conducts the GMU Repertory Orchestra and teaches Graduate and Undergraduate Conducting, Jazz Theory & Arranging and Advanced Sight-Singing. From 1996 to 2009, he conducted the GMU Symphony Orchestra and Chamber Orchestra. Under his direction, the ensembles at both Crane and George Mason University commissioned new works, made numerous recordings and appeared at national and international conferences.

Professor Maiello also makes professional appearances both nationally and abroad conducting music festivals, adjudicating ensembles and presenting clinics, lectures and workshops throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, the Bahamas and Europe. He conducted musical activities for the Gold Medal Ceremonies at the 1980 Winter Olympics in Lake Placid, New York; served as Musical Director for Music Festivals International; was selected as President of International Association of Jazz Educators – New York State Chapter; and is a quest

clinician for Yamaha Corporation and Warner Bros. Publications. In March of 2010, he was inducted into the Bands of America Hall of Fame at Music for All's Indianapolis headquarters.

Professor Maiello's professional recording credits include conducting the American Wind Symphony and additional studio ensembles for Alfred/Belwin Publications. Locally, Maiello has served as Associate Conductor of The McLean Orchestra, McLean, Virginia; been appointed an Honorary Conductor of The United States Navy Band, Washington, D.C.; and was a participant in the National Conducting Institute with Leonard Statkin and the National Symphony Orchestra in Washington, D.C., to which he has provided his services as a cover conductor.

Maiello received his Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Education from Ithaca College, Ithaca, New York in 1965 and 1967 respectively, and has extensive experience teaching in the public schools and at the university level. While at the Crane School of Music, Potsdam College of SUNY, Potsdam, New York, he served as a Professor of Music and Chairman of Performance, where he taught Advanced Instrumental Conducting, Applied Clarinet, Woodwind Techniques, Percussion Techniques and conducted the Crane Wind Ensemble.

Throughout his career, Maiello has published musical compositions for string orchestra and is the author of "Conducting Nuances" (GIA Publications, Inc.); "Conducting: A Hands-On-Approach" (Warner Bros./Alfred Publications); and co-author of "The 21st Century Band Method" (Warner Bros./Alfred Publications). In 2007, Maiello was awarded the title of "University Professor" by the GMU Board of Visitors, the highest rank given to Mason faculty members. Maestro Maiello is the founder and Conductor/Artistic Director of the American Festival Pops Orchestra, a professional ensemble in the greater Washington, D.C. metropolitan area dedicated to promoting and performing American popular music.

LEWIS BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

Dr. Richard Mayne-University of Northern Colorado, Greeley, CO



Richard Mayne currently serves as Professor of Music/Associate Director of Bands at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC), in Greeley. He is an elected member of the American Bandmasters Association and has also served on the National Band Association Board of Director's as Second Vice President. He was recently voted into the Colorado Bandmasters Association Hall of Fame as the 2013

Dr. Mayne has served as an adjudicator, clinician, and conductor throughout the United States, Canada, and China, and Japan, and Lebanon. Most recently he completed a semester long conductor in residence in Tokyo Japan conducting the Musashino Academia Musicae Wind Ensemble. He is also very busy in the state of Colorado as a clinician, mentor, and colleague to the public school directors. Student teacher mentoring and observation is also one of his UNC assignments.

Dr. Mayne is the conductor of the UNC Symphonic Band. The Symphonic Band is featured annually on the full-length CD recordings of Grand Mesa Music Publishing Company that are distributed internationally. Numerous clinics and concerts by the Symphonic Band have been given at the annual Colorado Music Educators Association convention. The Symphonic Band also gives an annual concert tour in Colorado.

In addition to his conducting responsibilities at UNC, Dr. Mayne teaches a variety of music education courses, including conducting and secondary instrumental methods courses. During his tenure. Dr. Mayne has also produced six CD recordings each featuring all three UNC concert bands as well as the marching band.

Dr. Mayne is also the director of the annual UNC Conducting Symposium, which features the Symphonic Band as the laboratory ensemble. This event brings 75 music educators to campus each January to work with internationally known clinicians.

In addition to conducting concert bands, Dr. Mayne served for five years as the music director and conductor of the Colorado (British) Brass Band Workshop in Gunnison, Colorado. He also served for five years as the music director and conductor for the Denver Orion Winds Double Woodwind Quintet, an ensemble focused on performing many of the chamber winds masterworks.

The UNC "Pride of the Rockies" Marching Band is also under the direction of Richard Mayne. In addition to its UNC performances, this organization has performed at several Denver Broncos professional football games. "The Pride" also gives an exhibition performance each year at one of the Colorado Bandmasters Association regional marching contests and is recognized in the Rocky Mountain region and the Big Sky Athletic Conference as an outstanding musical organization.

Dr. Mayne serves as Camp Director for the Colorado Masonic Band Camp, which is held on the UNC campus each summer. With the addition of two other camps he facilitates, approximately 480 students are on campus each summer for these three events.

The Colorado All-State High School Bands Festival is held on the UNC Campus each year, and Dr. Mayne serves as the Co-Director of the event. In addition, Dr. Mayne serves on the All-State audition team, spending a week traveling to sites around the state to audition students.

Before coming to UNC, Dr. Mayne completed his Ph.D. in Music Education at The Ohio State University (OSU). He studied conducting with Craig Kirchhoff and Richard Blatti and was the conductor of the OSU University Band for two years. He received his Bachelors and Masters degrees in Music Education from Arizona State University, where he studied conducting with Richard Strange and Robert Fleming, and trombone with Gail Wilson.

As a public school teacher, Dr. Mayne taught in Arizona at the high school level for eleven years, nine of those being at Dobson High School in Mesa, Arizona. While teaching public school, he served as President of the Arizona Band and Orchestra Directors Association and also played trombone in the Tempe Symphony Orchestra for ten years.

2013-14 SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award



Laurence Johnson — Coach, Director, Advisor

Laurence (Larry) Johnson was born and raised in Lemmon, South Dakota. He attended the University of South Dakota, receiving a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 1973. His teaching experience includes three years in Menno, two years in Clark, and 30 years in Pierre. While in Pierre, Larry taught for 12 years at the junior high, and in 1991 took over the band director duties at Riggs High School. In 2008, Larry, along with his wife Mary Jo, retired after 35 years of teaching. The Johnsons have two grown sons, Chris and Torn.

During his tenure in Pierre, the Riggs High School Band consistently earned Superior ratings at Large and Small Group Contests and has hosted Large Group on several occasions. Larry served as Regional Chairman of All-State

Band auditions for 18 years and hosted All-State Band on three occasions. Under his direction the Riggs High band performed at numerous State Basketball tournaments. He formed the drum line "Pierrecussion" which has been a staple at many tournament half-time performances. He has directed regional band festivals and been a marching band adjudicator,

Larry spent five summers at the Black Hills Playhouse serving as musician, set-builder, and music director. This experience led to numerous musical productions at the junior high, senior high, and the community. He has helped with One-Act Play Competitions both locally and at the State Competition.

In the summer Larry directs the Capitol City Band. The band performs at The Memorial Day and Veteran's Day programs each year as well as weekly concerts in the park throughout June and July. He encourages young people to continue playing during the summer and after they have graduated from high school. The band has several former students that as adults continue to perform sharing their time and talent.

Larry has been a member of South Dakota Bandmasters Association, South Dakota Music Educators Association, Phi Mu Alpha, and Phi Beta Mu. He was president of SDBA in 2000. In 2008, SDMEA honored him with the Distinguished Service to Music Award. Larry received the 2009-2010 National Federation of High Schools Outstanding Music Educator Award. At his final concert in May 2008, Larry was surprised with a band piece composed in his honor. The musical community of Pierre commissioned Ed Huckeby to compose a band piece to commemorate his service to the school and community. Dr. Huckeby directed the high school band and alumni in the premier performance of "Salutation and Celebration".



Alan Palsma — Coach, Director, Advisor

Alan Palsma graduated from Tyndall High School, and went on to earn an undergraduate degree from Southern State College and a graduate degree from the University of South Dakota. He taught in Armour, DeSmet, and Dalat School for Missionary Children in Penang, Malaysia before becoming band and vocal instructor at James Valley Christian School in 1981. He is still there today with a brief stint at Excel Christian Academy in Cartersville, Georgia in 2002-2003. Alan is a member of Phi Beta Mu and the South Dakota Bandmaster Association, serving on its executive board from 2009-2011. He also served on the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee from 2006-2013.

Alan has taught band, vocal, and elementary music for a total of 41 years, and would like everyone to know that he is possibly the only band director in South Dakota who is also a certified volleyball official.

Dr. Rolf Olson — Contest Official



Rolf Olson is Director of Bands and Professor of Trumpet at the University of South Dakota where he directs the Symphonic Band, Brass Choir, and teaches conducting and studio trumpet. He also performs with the USD faculty ensembles. South Dakota Brass Quintet, and South Dakota Jazz Quintet. Previous to USD, Olson taught public school music in the South Dakota communities of Arlington and Vermillion, and taught at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD.

Olson is an active trumpet player, performing regularly with the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, the Sioux Falls Big Band, and the Dalesburg Cornet Band of which he is comet soloist and musical director. He has performed twice at International Trumpet Guild Conventions and solved with numerous high school bands. In 2003, Oison performed the South Dakota premier of Robert Bradshaw's Sonata for Trumpet & Piano. He has also played professionally with the Carson &

Barnes Circus Band, Gene Pitney Orchestra, and Myron Floren.

Olson is an active guest clinician/conductor, having directed the Dakota Wind Ensemble, the Nebraska Class B All State Band, the South Dakota Middle School All State Band, the Northwest Iowa Honor Band, and numerous other band festivals and jazz festivals in South Dakota, Nebraska, and Iowa. He is active in the region as an adjudicator for all types of instrumental music competitions and serves as one of four adjudicators for the South Dakota All State Band auditions. Olson is co-founder of the South Dakota All State Jazz Festival and served for many years as Treasurer for the South Dakota Unit of the International Association of Jazz Educators (IAJE).

Dr. Olson earned the D.A. degree in Trumpet Performance and Pedagogy from the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, a M.M. degree in Trumpet Performance from the University of South Dakota, and a B.M. degree in Music Education from Augustana College. 2014 South Dakota Bandmasters Hall of Fame Inductee **Dennis Carison**

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association honors Dennis Carlson



At the time of his retirement in 2009, Dennis Carlson served schools in South-Central South Dakota for 33 years. Mr. Carlson attended Black Hills State University in Spearfish where he received his B.S. in both math and music. Later, he completed his Master's Degree in music education through the University of South Dakota.

Although he taught for two years in Winner, Mr. Carlson is most known for his time spent teaching in Chamberlain. For the majority of his career, Dennis taught at the elementary and middle school levels. With his fundamental-heavy approach, Mr. Carlson provided the Chamberlain band program with highly skilled musicians. During these years, his middle school groups were selected to perform for the South Dakota Music Conference four times. In his last six years of teaching, Dennis took over the Chamberlain High School program turning it into a musical force in central South Dakota, with numerous superior ratings and

all-state musicians. But it was Mr. Carlson's love for students that truly set him apart from normal teachers. "Mr. C" was a fixture at all school activities, to offer support for students and colleagues alike. It was a rare occurrence when Mr. Carlson was not in the stands.

Mr. Carlson's love for teaching did not stop with retirement. He remains an active adjudicator and clinician throughout the region. Mr. Carlson further impacted music education by volunteering for the South Dakota Bandmasters mentor program, ensuring that the state will have quality educators for years to come.

Dennis's honors include Outstanding Bandmaster Award (2001), Chamberlain High School Teacher of the Year (2003, 2009), National Federation of High Schools Outstanding Music Educator (2004), and Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Service Award (2008).

BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process until 2013, In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association. Starting in 2013 the complete sponsorship of the All-State Band is operated by the SDHSAA.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.


Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.


