CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

Dr. John R. Locke-University of North Carolina, Greensboro, NC



Since 1982, Dr. John R. Locke has served on the UNCG School of Music, Theatre and Dance Faculty as Director of Bands, Director of Summer Music Camps, conductor of the Wind Ensemble, and conducting teacher. He holds the Bachelor and Master of Music degrees from West Virginia University and the Doctor of Education degree from the University of Illinois. Prior to his arrival in North Carolina, Dr. Locke held teaching positions in music at West Virginia University, Southeast Missouri State University, and the University of Illinois. He has conducted band performances throughout the country including National Conventions of the MENC, CBDNA, ABA, the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., the Strathmore Center in Washington, DC, and Lincoln Center in New York City. Twice, the UNCG Wind Ensemble earned critical acclaim from The

Washington Post newspaper following concert performances in the nation's capital. Under Locke's leadership, the UNCG Wind Ensemble has released 16 commercially available compact discs including fireworks! which was a Grammy Entry List 2011 CD in two categories, "Classical Album of the Year" and "Best Orchestral Performance." In addition, he has guest conducted the U.S. Air Force Band, U.S. Army Field Band, U.S. Navy Band, "The President's Own" U.S. Marine Band, the Dallas Wind Symphony, as well as numerous university bands and all-state honor bands.

Dr. Locke has served as Editor of The North Carolina Music Educator and has published articles on band and wind ensemble literature in the Journal of Band Research and in Winds Quarterly, He is Past-President of the North Carolina Music Educators Association representing 2,200 members. Dr. Locke is a recipient of Phi Mu Alpha's Orpheus Award and has received the National Band Association Citation of Excellence on three occasions. He is a National Arts Associate of Sigma Alpha lota. In 1989, Dr. Locke was among the youngest conductors ever to be elected to membership in the prestigious American Bandmasters Association. In 1994, he received the Phi Beta Mu International Fraternity Outstanding Bandmaster of the Year Award, presented at the Mid-West International Band Clinic in Chicago. Dr. Locke is Past-President of the Southern Division of College Band Directors National Association and hosted the Southern Division Convention at UNCG in February 2000. In 2002, Dr. Locke was nominated for the O. Max Gardner Award, the highest award in the 16-campus UNC System. He also received the "Outstanding Music Teacher Award" in the UNCG School of Music in 2003, In 2005, Dr. Locke was elected President of the American Bandmasters Association and received the Albert Austin Harding Award from the American School Band Directors Association. In 2007, he received The Old North State Award from NC Governor Mike Easley "for dedication and service beyond excellence to the state of North Carolina." In 2009, Locke became Editor of the Journal of Band Research, a scholarly publication begun in 1962. In July 2012, Locke was honored by NC Governor Beverly Perdue with The Order of the Longleaf Pine Award, the highest civilian honor in North Carolina. In 2014, Locke was named the Marion Stedman Covington Stedman Distinguished Professor of Music at UNCG.

At UNCG, Dr. Locke is the founder and director of the Summer Music Camp program, now the largest university music camp in America, enrolling over 1,850 students annually and served by a staff of 160 professionals. He is also the founder of the Carolina Band Festival and Conductors Conference. Since 1977, he has administered summer music camps for over 65,000 students. He is in constant demand as a guest conductor, clinician, and adjudicator for band festivals throughout the United States and Canada.

LEWIS BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

Dr. Linda Moorhouse—University of Illinois, Urbana, II.



Dr. Linda R. Moorhouse joined the University of Illinois faculty in the fall of 2010 and currently serves as Associate Director for Undergraduate Affairs in the School of Music. also holds an appointment in the Bands Division as Senior Associate Director, where she teaches courses in graduate and undergraduate conducting. Ensembles under her direction have been featured at both national and regional conferences of the College Band Directors National Association, and the 2014 North American Saxophone Alliance International Conference. Prior to her Illinois appointment, she served on the faculty at Louisiana State University for over 20 years, where she was the recipient of select campus-wide awards for teaching excellence.

Dr. Moorhouse is active as a conductor, clinician and adjudicator both nationally and internationally and her service to the band profession is a matter of record. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the prestigious American Bandmasters Association, and is both a past president and the current Executive Secretary

of the National Band Association, where she also serves as Editor of the NBA Journal.

Recognized internationally as a Member Laureate of Sigma Alpha lota (professional fraternity for women in music), she was also awarded the "Diploma of the Sudler Order of Merit" from the John Philip Sousa Foundation in recognition of extraordinary service to the music community. The National Band Association has recognized her contributions to bands and band music on numerous occasions with the NBA Citation of Excellence. She is also a past President of Women Band Directors International.

In addition to her conducting and teaching obligations, Dr. Moorhouse has several notable publication credits including contributions to multiple volumes of both the Teaching Music Through Performance in Band (GIA) and A Composer's Insight (Meredith Music) series, along with other Meredith Music publications. Dr. Moorhouse received a Doctor of Musical Arts in Instrumental Conducting from the University of Washington, where she studied with Peter Erös and Timothy Salzman. She has a Master of Music Education degree from LSU, and a Bachelor of Music Education with Honors degree from the University of Florida. She is an elected member of the University of Florida Bands Hall of Fame.

Jackie Stacev graduated from Leola High School and Northern State University with a Bachelor of Music Education. Jackie started her career in Roslyn and Webster. In 1998 she became the High School Band Director in Watertown where she continues in that capacity today. Jackie directs the Concert Band, Symphonic Band, Arrow Dynamics, Jazz Band, Purple & Gold Pep Bands, and the Watertown Marching Arrow Band. Many of her students have been selected to participate in the SD All State Band.

Jackie hosts the SD All State Band Region Audition site and hosted All State Band in 2010. Jackie is again serving as site host for this year's All State Band performance in Watertown. She has been honored as

South Dakota Jaycee Teacher of the Year, Watertown Teacher of the Year and is a Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Service Award winner.

Grant Manhart



Grant Manhart currently serves as the Professor of Music at Northern State University in Aberdeen. He graduated from the University of Wisconsin and also holds a Master's degree in Trumpet Performance and Jazz Studies from Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and a Doctorate of Music, Trumpet Performance, Literature and Performance, Jazz Studies and Music History.

Dr. Manhart has been involved with All State Orchestra Brass, Percussion, Jazz trumpets and numerous jazz, solo/ensemble and band adjudications in South Dakota High Schools since 1998.

In 2002 Dr. Manhart received the Governor's Technology Grant to teach music on the Dakota Digital Network and in 2004 received the South Dakota Governor's Collaboration grant to create "Online Music 100".

Dr. Manhart was named Northern State University Outstanding Faculty in 2004. NSU Student group "Dominant 7" which Dr. Manhart created and directs, performs at 3 to 5 or more different High Schools annually, and received the South Dakota Touring Arts Grant in 2008, 2010, 2012 and 2014.

Dr. Manhart also gives vocal and band clinics and performances at South Dakota Elementary, Middle Schools and High Schools annually. Dr. Manhart was a sponsor, creator and facilitator at the 2015 International Trumpet Guild Conference "College Meet & Greet".

Grant and his wife Marcia have four children, Logan, Chase, Louis and Claire.

2015 South Dakota Bandmasters Hall of Fame Inductee Robert Carlson

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association honors Robert Carlson



A native of western New York, Bob Carlson attended State University College of New York in Fredonia, NY and graduated from Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell, SD in 1969. He holds a Masters of Music Education from the University of South Dakota in Vermillion and has also done extensive post-graduate work at St. Cloud State University, South Dakota State University, University of South Dakota, Mankato State University, Southwest State University, and the University of Wisconsin. Bob also served eleven years with the 147th Army National Guard Band in Mitchell, South Dakota.

Bob Carlson has been the driving force behind many great ensembles throughout his forty-four years of teaching. After building an outstanding program in Parkston, Bob moved on to teach in Pipestone, Minnesota. While there, he was able to lead the Pipestone marching band to sweepstakes wins at several marching competitions. However, Bob Carlson will long be remembered throughout the state for his tenure at Sioux Falls Lincoln. While at Lincoln, his bands performed at the Tournament of Roses Parade, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, and the South Dakota Bandmasters Convention four times. His students were consistently accepted into the All-State and even set the record for number of students selected in 2010 (37 students). Bob's dedication to each of his individual students is what made all of these accolades and accomplishments possible. He had a knack for pushing students beyond what they thought was possible.

During his career, Bob has served on boards for SDBA, Phi Beta Mu, and MMEA. He also served as Associate Director of America's Mid-West Ambassadors of Music European tour and was Head Director in 2011. Bob has received Outstanding Alumni Educator from Dakota Wesleyan University (2001), Bandmaster of the Year (2006), Outstanding Music Educator for the Upper Mid-West (2006), SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award (2010), and the Phi Beta Mu Distinguished Service Award (2012).

BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the Alf-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the Alf-State Band and both have been involved with the process until 2013. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the Alf-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association. Starting in 2013 the complete sponsorship of the Alf-State Band is operated by the SDHSAA.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, an etude, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.


