## Program

#### Overture to

"CANDIDE".....Leonard Bernstein/arr. by Walter Beeler

Candide (1956) is an operetta by Leonard Bernstein in the vein of Offenbach and Gilbert and Sullivan. Its music has all the wit and sophistication that is associated with that genre. This is immediately apparent in the Overture which is built on the interval of a minor seventh followed by a major second. This becomes the "battle scene" music of the operetta followed by a lyrical contrast. This entire section is then repeated with lighter orchestration and is followed by a brilliant codetta. The Overture concludes with a shower of musical sparks utilizing fragments of everything already heard.

#### Black is the Color.....arr. by Robert Sheldon

Black is the Color (1921) is a traditional Appalachian folk song of Scottish origin. The original tune "Black is the Color" was collected by English composer and folk song archivist Cecil Sharp. The tune that is best known today is that assigned to the traditional lyrics by John Jacob Niles.

#### Vesuvius.....Frank Ticheli

Ticheli's own program note best describes his intent in writing Vesuvius. "Mount Vesuvius, the volcano that destroyed Pompeii in 79 A.D. is an icon of power and energy in this work. Originally I had in mind a wild and passionate dance such as might have been performed at an ancient Roman Bacchanalia. I began to envision something more explosive and fiery. With its driving rhythms, exotic modes and quotations from the Dies Irae from the medieval Requiem Mass, it became evident that the Bacchanalia I was writing could represent a dance from the final days of the doomed city of Pompeii."

#### Strange Humors......John Mackey

This piece opens with a sultry Bassoon solo representing most notably the melodies of Egypt. Later, the saxophones emulate the snaking lines of the Bassoon. The addition of brass and auxiliary percussion to the original orchestration makes for particular impact during the shout sections of the piece, and the groove of the djembe combined with the quirky rhythms throughout leave an impression that lingers in the listener's mind long after its conclusion.

"Americans We" was written by Henry Fillmore in 1929. The dedication was "To all of us." There are three different moods that are suggested. The first and second strains are sprightly and are played staccato with the trio performed more legato and flowing. The flourishing trumpet fanfares characterize this as one of Fillmore's greatest marches.

#### **About Brandon Valley School District:**

Brandon Valley School District is on the eastern edge of South Dakota, bordering Minnesota and Iowa. Brandon Valley is the fifth largest school district in South Dakota and consists of a high school, middle school, intermediate school and four elementary schools.

#### **About Brandon Valley High School:**

Brandon Valley High School is located in Brandon and serves 1100 students. The building was constructed in 1968 and has gone through numerous expansions and renovations to meet the growing enrollment and instructional needs. The school is administered by Dr. Gregg Talcott – Principal, Mr. Mark Schlekeway – Associate Principal, and Mr. Randy Marso – Activities Principal.

#### About the Music Department at Brandon Valley High School:

There are three large choirs under the direction of Mr. Terry Gullickson. Over 150 students are involved in vocal music at Brandon Valley High School. The Brandon Valley Orchestra of 48 students is directed Mrs. Shelly Berg. Over one-third of the total student body is involved in music at Brandon Valley High School.

#### **About Brandon Valley High School Bands:**

The band program consists of three concert bands and two jazz bands, totaling over 150 students. The bands are the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Concert Band, Jazz I and Jazz II. Each concert band meets daily for 46 minutes, and each jazz band meets weekly for 90 minutes. The bands combine for marching band, which this year numbered over 150 members. Bob Carlson, Dale Miller and Bob Goheen have teamed up to lead the Brandon Valley High School bands this semester. The middle school bands are directed by Calvin Lipetzky. The intermediate school bands are directed by Del Hubers and Laura Schenk. The Brandon Valley High School Marching Lynx have performed and competed all across the country including the Macy's Day Parade, the Liberty Bowl, Gator Bowl, Holiday Bowl and Fiesta Bowl. The band program is supported by a very active booster organization.
