This spirited fanfare was commissioned in honor of the 100-year celebration of the town Dacula, Georgia. While clearly centered on the key of F Major, it also plays with shifting tonalities and exciting cluster chords. The layering of moving lines on top of block chords provides an exciting musical contrast.

Themes from First Suite In Eb......Gustav Holst, arr. Michael Sweeney

Holst's *First Suite in E-Flat for Military Band* has become one of the most-performed works in the band music repertoire, and is historically important for helping to usher in an era when renowned composers of the day began to give serious attention to music for bands. Michael Sweeney has done an excellent job reducing the technical demand of the original piece while still maintaining the music's emotional integrity.

The well-known and touching Irish ballad *Danny Boy* forms the basis of this emotionally charged setting. Sustained chords in the upper woodwinds, accompanied by solo alto saxophone establish an environment of peace and tranquility in the opening. The piece builds steadily to a full ensemble climax before returning to a soft and delicate close. Richard Saucedo has done a wonderful job of writing an accessible work for young band that is full of opportunities to teach elements of musicality.


