

CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

Dr. Jason Caslor



Dr. Jason Caslor was appointed Associate Director of Bands and Orchestras at Arizona State University in 2015. In addition to directing various instrumental ensembles, Caslor also mentors graduate conducting students, and teaches undergraduate and graduate conducting courses.

From 2010-2015, Caslor served as Assistant Professor of Instrumental Conducting at Memorial University in St. John's, Newfoundland, Canada where he conducted the Wind Ensemble and oversaw the undergraduate and graduate instrumental conducting programs. Prior to that, Jason spent three seasons as Resident Conductor with the Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra (TBSO). During

his tenure with the TBSO, he conducted over 75 concerts (including a CBC Radio national broadcast), designed and implemented numerous education and outreach initiatives, was instrumental in helping secure numerous local, provincial, and national grants, and recorded a full-length, internationally distributed CD with Canadian blues artist Rita Chiarelli.

Recipient of an "Excellence in Teaching Award" from the Memorial University of Newfoundland Students' Union in 2012, Caslor also spent several years teaching in the public school system as an instrumental and choral instructor. His commitment to conductor training stemmed from being a faculty member with the annual Canadian Wind Conductors Development Program from 2005-2011. He is active as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor for festivals, honor bands and music camps.

Caslor's current research interests include improving the ways musicians can collaborate via the Internet, improvisation as it pertains to both conducting pedagogy and large ensembles, and incorporating United Sound, a school-based instrumental music club for individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities and their typical peers, at the collegiate level. In addition to numerous regional engagements, he has conducted the National Youth Band of Canada and presented his research at the College Band Directors National Association National Conference, the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles International Conference, and the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic.

Caslor completed his Doctorate of Musical Arts (Conducting) at Arizona State University. Prior to earning a Master of Music (Conducting) degree from the University of Manitoba, Jason earned his Bachelor of Music and Bachelor of Education degrees from the University of Saskatchewan.

Dr. Christopher Chapman



Dr. Christopher Chapman is the Director of Bands for the Oregon State University Department of Music, where he conducts the Wind Ensemble and Chamber Winds. Dr. Chapman guides all aspects of the program, and coordinates the wind band conducting area. Under his direction, the OSU Band Program has gained notoriety and praise from composers and audiences alike. Having toured extensively, the OSU Wind Ensemble has been featured in performance sites from Carnegie Hall in New York City to concert halls on the west coast of the United States as well as Japan and Taiwan. Their commercial recording projects, The Five Changes, and Currents, was produced by

lark Records. This year, the ensemble will produce David Maslanka's Mass and cenic Meditations.

riginally from Columbus, Ohio, Chapman holds degrees in music from The Ohio tate University, University of Nevada, Las Vegas, and the University of Washingn. Dr. Chapman has appeared as a conductor, clinician and lecturer throughout e United States. He has also been a contributing author in A Composer's Insight: houghts, Analysis and Commentary on Contemporary Masterpieces for Wind and, a series of books on contemporary wind band composers for Meredith Music ublications, a subsidiary of the Hal Leonard Corporation and Teaching Music rough Performance by GIA Publications. Dr. Chapman's wind band compositions and arrangements are receiving performances across the United States.

2015, Dr. Chapman was elected to the prestigious American Bandmasters Assoation. He has been the Northwest Division president the College Band Directors ational Association and Northwest Divisional Chair of the National Band Associan. An inductee into the Phi Beta Mu honorary Bandmasters Fraternity, he is also honorary member of the Kappa Kappa Psi Honorary Band Fraternity where he as served as the Co-Governor of the Western District, and an honorary member the Tau Beta Sigma honorary band sorority. Other organizations include the orld Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, Oregon Band Directors sociation, National Association for Music Educators, and Oregon Music Educars Association. Dr. Chapman also serves as the Musical Director of the Oregon ass Society, a British-style brass band in Springfield, Oregon and the Portland ind Symphony, a professional adult band in Portland, Oregon.

2018 South Dakota Bandmasters Hall of Fame Inductee James McKinney

The South Dakota Bandmasters Association honors James McKinney



A native of Hapeville, Georgia, Jim McKinney attended Georgia State University and graduated from Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, OK in 1970. He holds a Masters of Music from the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, AR.

Some of the highlights of Mr. McKinney's work include the national and worldwide recognition brought to SDSU, community, state, and region through the "Pride of the Dakotas" Marching Band appearances in President Clinton's Inaugural Parade (1977), the National Independence Day Parade and Public Broadcasting's "A Capitol Fourth" (2000), and two Tournament of Roses Parades (2003 and 2008). Jim's leadership of the Iowa State University Marching Band

ontributed to that group receiving the 2017 Sudler Trophy. McKinney conceived and developed the Brookings Optimist Jazz Festival and was co-founder of the revised South Dakota InterCollegiate Band. Jim's work with the SDSU Symphonic Band, the Brookings Area Community Band, and the Dakota Wind Ensemble received wide acclaim and high artistic praise.

During his career, Jim has received numerous honors including being selected as an Outstanding Young Man of America, SDSU College of Arts and Sciences Teacher of the Year, Phi Beta Mu awards or Distinguished Service and Outstanding Bandmaster of the Year. Mr. McKinney was the 2010 Reipient of the SDSU Alumni Association's Distinguished Service Award for Outstanding Service to South Dakota. Jim is an elected member of The American Bandmasters Association.

Mr. McKinney has written numerous articles, several of which have been published in journals ach as <u>Band World</u>, and in collections such as the <u>Percussion Anthology</u>. Mr. McKinney retired from outh Dakota State University in 2009. He carries the title of Professor Emeritus of Music and Direcor Emeritus of The Pride of the Dakotas.

SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award



Helen Mogen has been a music educator in Nebraska, Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota for 41 years. As a band director she has directed concert bands, pep bands, marching bands, jazz band and musical theatre. Her bands have consistently earned superior ratings at SDHSAA music contests. Many students have been in SD All-State Band, Orchestra, Jazz Band and SD Middle School All-State Band.

Helen is on the SDHSAA Music Advisory Committee and SDHSAA Calendar Committee. She has been a SDHSAA Region 2 Chairperson for over 20 years and adjudicator for region contest. Helen co-founded SD Bandmasters Summer Symposium and is the president of the SD Bandmasters.

She has hosted the SDBA Piano contest, the BEC middle school contest, and hosts and manages the Lake Area Festival of Bands Parade Competition as well as conductor of several area honor bands and festivals. In her spare time she is on staff for the Midwest Ambassador European Tour and the SDSU All-State Music Camp.

Helen is currently the band director in Chester where the Chester Band has been selected to play at the South Dakota Bandmasters in 2006 and 2016. Members of the Chester Band performed live on state with the Liverpool Legends in Branson, Missouri. Chester was named one of the 100 Best Communities for Music Education in the Nation.

In 2012 Helen was inducted into the South Dakota Rock & Roll Association Hall of Fame as a member of the "Something New Band" which she still plays with.

BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process until 2013. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association. Starting in 2013 the complete sponsorship of the All-State Band is operated by the SDHSAA.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.


