Scott Prebys is Chairman of the Music Department at the University of Mary in Bismarck, North Dakota. He holds performance degrees from the University of Colorado (M.M.) and Indiana State University (B.S.) A percussionist, he directs the jazz studies program and lectures in music theory.

Under his direction, the UM Jazz Ensemble has performed at jazz festivals in three countries and annually performs with nationally prominent guest artists in the jazz idiom. The UMJE recently released their second recording, "Live at Montreux".

Scott is a clinician for the Yamaha Music Instrument Company and appears frequently in the United States and Canada. He is a faculty member at The International Music Camp and he maintains an active performance schedule.

DAUGHERTY, DAVIS & McPARTLAND

From Cedar Rapids, Iowa, this highly acclaimed trio blends an eclectic array of musical styles.

On keyboard, the founder of the group, is Tim Daugherty. Daugherty has been studying music since the age of 15. In a addition to his ease and versatility at the keyboard, Daugherty also composes much of the music performed by the ensemble. The original scores are the cornerstone of this groups much-earned success and respect. An affirmation to the quality of his arrangements is the fact that audiences enjoy them.

On saxophone, and taking over lead vocals, is Bill Davis. Davis has been perfecting his art for 20 years. He has enjoyed success performing with warm-up bands for Chicago, the Doobies, Eric Clapton, and others. His ability to interact and include the audience is a definite draw and his singing abilities have been compared to Al Jarreau.

In this ensemble, the drummer is more than just a time-keeper. Dennis McPartland receives a wide variety of sounds and rhythms from relatively few strokes; in other words, he is professional.
