

## LEWIS BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

### Dr. Travis Cross



Travis J. Cross serves as professor of music at UCLA, where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, directs the graduate wind conducting program, and chairs the music department. He was also associate dean for academic mentoring and opportunity during the initial years of the UCLA Herb Alpert School of Music. Cross has conducted the UCLA Wind Ensemble at the California All-State Music Education Conference and College Band Directors National Association Western/Northwestern Division conference and prepared the band for centenary performances of Leonard Bernstein's *Mass* with Gustavo Dudamel and the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

Cross previously taught five years at Virginia Tech and four years at Edina (Minn.) High School. He earned doctor and master of music degrees in conducting from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, and the bachelor of music degree cum laude in vocal and instrumental music education from St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. His principal teachers were Mallory Thompson and Timothy Mahr.

Cross contributed a chapter to volume four of *Composers on Composing for Band*, available from GIA Publications. His more than twenty original compositions and arrangements are published by Boosey & Hawkes, Daehn Publications, and Theodore Music. He has appeared as a guest conductor, composer, and clinician in more than thirty states, Canada, China, Korea, Singapore, Spain, Thailand, and the United Arab Emirates; and at the Midwest Clinic and has engagements in California, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Minnesota, Texas, Wyoming, Virginia, and Korea during the 2019–20 season. Cross is a Yamaha Master Educator.

## CLARK BAND GUEST CONDUCTOR

**Dr. Aaron Perrine**



With works in a variety of genres, Aaron Perrine's music has been performed by some of the leading ensembles and soloists across the United States and beyond. He is a two-time winner of the American Bandmasters Association Sousa/Ostwald Award for his compositions: *Only Light* in 2015 and *Pale Blue on Deep* in 2013. *Only Light*—commissioned by the University of Iowa Symphony Band, Richard Mark Heidel, conductor—was included on the latest University of Kansas Wind Ensemble recording (*Of Shadow and Light, Klavier*). Another one of his compositions—*Temperance*—recently won the 2017 CBDNA Young

Band Composition Contest. His music for winds has also been featured at the 2017 CBDNA National Conference, multiple regional CBDNA Conferences, The Midwest Clinic, The Western International Band Clinic, and at numerous all-state, state conference and honor band concerts.

Perrine's music for saxophone has also received many notable performances. *Primal*—for saxophone quartet—was performed at the 2014 NASA Biennial Conference in Urbana-Champaign, Illinois, and the 2012 World Saxophone Congress XVI in St. Andrews, Scotland. *Bridge Suite*—for alto saxophone and cello—was performed at the 2012 NASA Biennial Conference in Tempe, Arizona. This past summer, *It Has to Be Beautiful*, a concerto for alto saxophone and wind ensemble, was premiered by Kenneth Tse with the Symphonic Wind Orchestra of Croatian Armed Forces at the 2018 World Saxophone Congress, in Zagreb, Croatia.

In addition to composing, Perrine is an active conductor and educator. He has conducted a variety of honor bands, with his most recent appearance being the 2018 All-Iowa 8th Grade Honor Band. Future conducting engagements include the 2021 South Dakota All-State Band. He is currently on the faculty at Cornell College in Mt. Vernon, Iowa.

## SDHSAA Distinguished Service Award



Dr. Terry Beckler has been judging music contests for over 30 years. He is an active music adjudicator in South Dakota, and has also been an adjudicator/clinician in New Mexico, Guam, Minnesota, and North Dakota. Dr. Beckler has judged drumset and vibraphone for All-State jazz band since 2008, has judged percussion for the South Dakota Middle School All-State Band

for 6 years, and has judged for All-State Band since 2015.

Dr. Beckler is a member of the U.S. Army National Guard and was awarded the Howard Citation of Musical Excellence with the 147th Army Band in 2006. He was the SD Army National Guard Warrant Officer in 2009. Dr. Beckler was awarded the SD Bandmaster of the Year Award and was inducted into the Aberdeen Central High School Hall Of Fame in 2018. He is a Professor of Music at Northern State university and currently holds military rank of Chief Warrant Officer 5 and is the Chief of the U.S. Army National Guard Bands. He is a member of the SD Bandmasters, Percussive Arts Society, U.S. Army Warrant Officer Association, and the American Legion. Dr. Beckler's passion for music education has been greatly appreciated over the past few decades, and the SDHSAA is honored to present him with our highest award.

# BRIEF HISTORY OF SOUTH DAKOTA ALL-STATE BAND

The first South Dakota All-State Band was held in 1951 in Sioux Falls at Washington High School with Frank Simon as the guest conductor. The All-State Band project was organized by the South Dakota Bandmasters Association (SDBA). No judges were used in selecting the members of that first All-State Band. Chair placements for each section of the Band were determined by brief auditions that were held during the first hour of the day. The auditions were listened to by the band directors. Following the auditions the band was seated and the rehearsal began at 9:30 a.m. The same format was used for the All-State Band in 1952.

In 1952 the SDBA decided to hire two judges to audition students across the state. In 1961 the SDBA increased the number of All-State judges to four.

Beginning in 1962 the All-State Band began a new phase in its history when the Band became a joint project of the SDBA and the South Dakota High School Interscholastic Activities Association (SDHSIAA). The two organizations oversaw the All-State Band and both have been involved with the process until 2013. In 1965-66 the SDHSIAA changed its name to the South Dakota High School Activities Association (SDHSAA). Starting in 1962 the general supervision and control of the All-State Band has been in the hands of the SDHSAA while a major part of the planning and operation of the Band being in the hands of the Bandmasters Association. Starting in 2013 the complete sponsorship of the All-State Band is operated by the SDHSAA.

Prior to 1974 the All-State Band would first meet on Friday morning, sight read the music to be performed, and then begin rehearsals for the Saturday concert. In 1973 a decision was made to give the concert music to the All-State students at the February Music In-Service. Also, a Thursday evening rehearsal was added to the schedule. These changes have allowed the All-State Band to perform some of the most difficult and best music available for bands. Since that time the quality of the South Dakota All-State band has compared with any in the nation.

Today's process for selecting the students consists of students auditioning for the same judges throughout the state within a three week period. Students are asked to prepare a solo, major scales, minor scales, and a chromatic scale. They are also auditioned on sight-reading music which is composed by the judges and the students take a test on music terminology. A composite score is compiled for each student and the students with the lowest scores in each section comprise the All State Band. This audition system has remained largely intact since 1961.

Beginning with the 2006 All-State Concert a major change in the All State Band took place when the traditional one large All-State Band was divided into two smaller, but equally talented bands. The two band format is an attempt to adapt to the band music which is now being composed for smaller symphonic bands.


