BHS Director of Bands

Mr. Ronald Stary is in his twenty-third year of teaching music. He started in South Dakota on the Cheyenne-Eagle Butte Reservation, where he met his wife Dawn. Their family includes three children; Ben, Amanda, and Adam (who played percussion & drum set at BHS) and their dog "Lenny".

Prior to his teaching post at Brookings, Stary taught for over a decade in Montevideo, MN, CGB and Cannon Falls, MN. While at MHS, the bands toured New York, Boston, Southern California, St. Louis, and Washington D.C. Under his direction, the MHS Jazz Band won several MSHSL section 12AA "best at site" contest awards, and held an annual "flood of jazz" show to sell-out crowds, hosting over 22 professional jazz artists. Every year of his tenure, MHS had students in All-State Band and superior ratings at large group festival. In 2007, the MHS marching band won their class at Alexandria Vikingland competition, the unofficial state championship in parade marching. In 2009, he started the "212 Regiment", a unique Marching band program that combined two separate school districts to competed in the Minnesota summer parade circuit.

Mr. Stary grew up in Saint Paul, Minnesota. His father was a trombonist for National Guard band in the 1950's. Stary did begin band in school, but his love for music deepen at age 12 when traveling with the St. Paul Scouts Drum & Bugle. His band director at Como Park Senior High was Mr. Alton Burns, a jazz saxophonist. Helping strengthen this young musicians music reading skills, Mr. Burns encouraged arranging for jazz ensemble.

Mr. Stary marched in the "27th Lancers", a top 10 DCI drum & bugle corps from Boston, Mass. Upon returning to the Midwest, he studied at the University of Minnesota- Minneapolis, graduating with a bachelor's degree in music education. Studied conducting under Dr. Richard Hansen and trombone privately with Mr. Steven Lund. While at the "U", he had the honor of playing in many ensembles, including the chamber orchestra & the top jazz ensemble one. Toured Scandinavia-Russia with the wind ensemble under the late Dr. Frank Bencrisutto, Director of Bands Emeritus. Mr. Stary is a member of SD Bandmasters Association.

Since 2010, The BHS band program has traveled to New York City and the Sherburne Pageant of Bands, received superior ratings each year at large group contest, and increased participation in solo/ensemble by over 60%. The marching band program has new uniforms, and placed as a top ten finalist at the Sioux Falls Festival of Bands competition two years in a row, a school record. This spring, the jazz program will hold it's 4th annual jazz show featuring both Jazz Bands 1 & 2, BHS vocal jazz groups, BHS strings along with professional guest artists Matt Patnode - saxophone, and Tim Farrell - trumpet.

Special Guest Artists

Dr. Aaron Ragsdale is Assistant Professor of Percussion and Assistant Director of Bands at South Dakota State University where he teaches applied percussion and percussion pedagogy, conducts both the Pride of the Dakotas Drum Line and SDSU Percussion Ensemble, serves as Assistant Director with the Pride of the Dakotas Marching Band, and helps direct and administrate the annual All-State Music Camp.

In addition to his duties at SDSU, Dr. Ragsdale has served as a clinician, conductor, and adjudicator for middle and high school students in South Dakota, Arkansas and Oklahoma and regularly performs at the regional and national level. In addition to his membership in the percussion section of the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, he has appeared four times at the Percussive Arts Society International Convention (PASIC)—including the World Premiere of *Woods Walker* for marimba and electronics at the 2010 convention—and at the National Convention on Percussion Pedagogy.


A native of Fayetteville, Arkansas, Dr. Ragsdale holds a DMA from Rutgers University, a Master of Music degree from the University of Arkansas, and a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Oklahoma. He lives in Brookings with his wife, Ashley, daughter, Olivia, and son, Harrison.

Dr. Nathan Jorgensen is Assistant Professor of Woodwinds and Jazz at South Dakota State University. He is responsible for teaching applied saxophone lessons, and directs both of the University Jazz Ensembles.

An active performer of all styles of music, Jorgensen has performed throughout the United States as a soloist and with touring groups. He also traveled to China to perform as part of the US/China Friendship Program. He won a Down Beat Music Award with the KU Saxophone Quartet in 2006, and was the soprano saxophone soloist on the title track of the KU Wind Ensemble recording *Redline Tango* available from the Naxos label. He has had the opportunity to perform engagements with the Kansas City Symphony, Boulevard Big Band, River City Jazz Orchestra, New Century Big Band, KU Symphony Orchestra, South Dakota Jazz Orchestra, New Theater Restaurant, KU Opera, Dakota Wind Ensemble, and the SDSU-Civic Symphony. Jorgensen has had the opportunity to back such artists as Bobby Watson, Paquito D'Rivera, Slide Hampton, Bob Sheppard, Dave Liebman, John Abercrombie, Victor Lewis, Marilyn Maye, Peter Erskine, and Patti Austin. Dr. Jorgensen is director of the SDSU/Brookings Optimist Jazz Festival.

The Brookings Band Program

The Brookings School District Instrumental Band program starts in 5th grade at Camelot Intermediate. 6 grade Band, 7 & 8 grade Band meet every other day at Mickelson Middle School, supported by group lessons. Band activities for grades 9 through 12 are centered around the Symphonic & Concert Band. District Bands under the instruction of Mrs. Mary Cogswell, Mrs. Cheryl Todey and Mr. Ron Stary.

The Brookings H.S. Jazz Program

The Brookings High School Jazz program is an extra -curricular extension of our complete HS band program. Jazz band does not meet during the school day, starts in November and ends May 2nd with the annual jazz show in the spring. Jazz one is by audition and Jazz two is open to all interested students. For Jazz One, rehearsals are held one afternoon, and two mornings a week. Sectionals are held by student leaders. They attend 4-5 jazz festivals a season—first time ever attending a jazz fest in January this year. Jazz at BHS is viewed as a chamber group experience for the best musicians who are expected to learn several charts & play in several styles, take risks and communicate musically. The program brings in guest artists every year for the Annual Jazz Show. The "flood of jazz" show is a unique format where jazz students are placed in the spotlight and highlighted in this season finale.
